A report was received from the select committee appointed at the last meeting to consider the rearrangement of the districts of the Relieving Officers. It recommended that the number of districts should be reduced from three to two; that the village of Spittal should be added to the district of Berwick instead of Islandshire; that J B Atkinson, Relieving Officer for Berwick, should have an assistant, at a salary of £50 per annum, in recognition of the increased duties; that the remainder of the Union should form the second district, with a Relieving Officer resident in the centre of the area; that Joseph Scott, currently Relieving Officer for Norhamshire, should be appointed to the new district, with an increase of salary. The Board decided to consider the report at the meeting of 5 May.	
The Workhouse Committee reported that Mrs Purdie, Matron of the Workhouse, had applied for an increase of salary. The recommended that consideration should be deferred until the meeting of 5 May when the new Board would have taken office.	
The School Committee reported that the appointment of a pupil teacher was necessary to assist the schoolmaster, Mr Nesbit [William Nesbit], and they recommended that a boy should be taken on trial in the position fro two months. They also recommended that the Relieving Officers should make quarterly returns of the number of children in their districts, with details of the schools they attended and their attendance record. No payment should be made for any child whose weekly attendance was less than four days.	
The Special Committee, appointed on 28 January to consider the application from the clerk of the Burial Board for the exchange of land of Grangeburn Mill owned by the parish of Berwick for land granted by the Corporation of Berwick for a burial ground, had asked William Lowrey and Thomas Mason to value the land. A letter from Lowrey	

			 and Mason to J C Weddell gave a valuation of the areas of land required, with recommendations about fences. The Poor Law Board was to be asked to order a meeting of the inhabitants of the parish of Berwick to agree to the exchange. In view of the illness of Mr Atkinson, Relieving Officer for Berwick, John Thompson, Assistant Overseer for the parish of Berwick, was appointed for one month as his temporary substitute.
