They left the hospital at 9.30am and went to the Black Bull, where they were refused liquor. They were served beer at the White Swan and whisky and beer at the Commercial Inn, which they paid for. They bought a flask of whisky, and consumed it outside. At 3pm one of the men was found on his back, drunk. He was taken to a house and given stimulants and returned to the hospital a few hours later. Privates JW DOWSON and George EASTON, two of the military patients at the hospital were called as witnesses to confirm that they had been served liquor. Roderick URQUHART confirmed that the Black Bull had refused to serve the men. He could tell that they were from the hospital because of their dress. While cycling near Lowick, just before 3pm, he saw one soldier lying on his back and the other two, under the influence. He reported them to the police station. Mr HENDERSON acting for the defence said both licence holders were of good character: it was an error of judgement. Mrs COULTHARD had been in the White Swam all her life and was over 70: she had not observed their dress until after they had been served.
