WANTED

AT BERWICK-UPON-TWEED, charged with abandoning a Child in this BOROUGH, on the 13th or 14th May, 1885:

A WOMAN, from 25 to 35 years of age, rather tall and stout, Dark Hair, some of her front Teeth a-wanting.

Dressed in Dark Clothing and Black Straw Hat, spoke the Northumberland dialect.

The Child is a Male, from 2 to 6 months old, small size and very thin, with scabs on head, presently in Berwick Workhouse. Clothing on Child—White Cotton Shirt, 2 Flannel Petticoats, one White and the other Red, Frock, Red and Black Checked (checks about an inch square), Blue Checked or Spotted Pinafore, 2 Shoulder Shawls, Colours, Red and Black, and a Paisley Shawl or Plaid, all in fair condition.

On the night of the 13th ult., about 7 p.m., a woman carrying a child wrapped in a shawl of the above description, called at Berwick Railway Station and asked for a train for Reston. On being told she could not get one that night, she left and was seen on the Paxton Road shortly after, where she asked the way to Reston and Coldstream; she also spoke of Alnwick, and seemed in a distressed state; the child was found in a Coalhouse at Lethamshank on the morning of the 14th May.

It is requested that search and enquiry be made for this person, and if found that she be apprehended, and any information regarding her to be communicated to JOHN GARDEN, Superintendent of Police, Berwick-upon-Tweed, who is authorised by the Guardians of the Berwick-upon-Tweed Union to offer the above Reward for her apprehension.
