Volume	GGL 1	Glendale Board of Guardians minute book outlining the business of the Guardians in administering Poor Relief in the Glendale Union, 23 August 1883 to 7 July 1887.	<p>As there is no evidence of elections of Guardians having been held during the period covered by this volume, it has been next to impossible to establish whether the names put down in the minute book as having been present at the meetings were actually Guardians or people who had been requested to attend in their professional capacity or otherwise.
